## 1. End behavior of a function


Investigating the *end behavior of a function* means determining how the function behaves for x very large in the positive and negative directions, that is, determine  $\lim_{x\to\infty} f(x)$  and  $\lim_{x\to\infty} f(x)$ . We will only be considering the end behavior of a polynomial function.

For a polynomial function, the end behavior is determined by the behavior of the term of highest degree.

In order to determine the end behavior of  $f(x) = -3x^3 - 4x^2 + 7x + 2$ , the end behavior is determined by the term  $-3x^3$ . Please answer the following end behavior questions: (1 Point)

- (e) Determine the intervals on which the function is concave up and those on which it is concave down and then state whether the function actually has an inflection point at each point in part (d). (2 Points)
- (f) Determine the end behavior of the function.

- (g) Using the information above, sketch a graph of the function, showing any local extreme points and inflection points. (2 Points)
