All individuals have the right to access supportive measures and resources. You will not be forced to file a formal complaint or police report. Please be aware that the College may take action on its own if essential to protect the safety of the community.

Faculty are considered mandated reporters who are required to report sexual misconduct to the Title IX Coordinator. In turn, the Title IX Coordinator must offer supportive measures and information about reporting options. While faculty members encourage students to share information related to their life experiences through discussion and written work, students should understand that faculty are required to report past and present sexual assault, domestic/dating violence, stalking, and gender based discrimination that is shared with them. Faculty also must report past or current child abuse.

Montgomery College encourages anyone experiencing sexual misconduct to talk to someone about what happened, so they can get the support they need and the College can respond appropriately.
