

Reporting to Faculty: What to Know:

Faculty members are designated as mandated reporters and are obligated by College policy to report incidents of sexual misconduct—including the identity of the individual disclosing—to the Title IX Coordinator. Upon receiving such a report, the Title IX Coordinator is responsible for providing supportive measures and outlining available reporting options.

While faculty encourage students to express personal experiences through class discussions and written assignments, it's important for students to be aware that any disclosure of past or current sexual assault, domestic or dating violence, stalking, or child abuse must be reported. This reporting requirement is in place to ensure student safety and access to appropriate resources.

Confidential Reporting Option: The College strongly encourages anyone who has experienced sexual misconduct to speak with someone about their experience. Doing so ensures access to the support and care they deserve, and allows the College to respond in a meaningful and appropriate way.

If you prefer to speak with someone at the College while maintaining your privacy, we recommend reaching out to the College Counseling Center, where confidential support is available.
