


Blackboard Learn Ultra Basics (Room BE 151/152)

This workshop covers the basics of Blackboard Learn Ultra, from the interface and navigation to best practices when building a new course. The MC Learn Ultra Transition team will take you on a tour of MC's Blackboard Learn Ultra resources, provide answers to FAQs, and introduce how to configure your course settings to allow you to teach in Ultra for the Spring 2025 semester if you would like to do so. From Fall 2025 onwards, all courses at MC will be in Blackboard Learn Ultra.

Blackboard Learn Ultra – 10 Tips & Tricks (Room BE 147)

Title IX at Montgomery College: Understanding your obligations and how best to support students (Room BE 107)

Faculty play a critical role in responding to student disclosures of sex-based discrimination, including sexual harassment, dating/domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking. As mandated reporters, it's critical that faculty know when and how to report to the Title IX Coordinator. Just as importantly, faculty also play a key role in providing supportive measures to students to support academic success. Participants will gain an understanding of Title IX at Montgomery College, which may differ from Title IX compliance at other institutions of higher education where part time faculty teach. This session will be interactive, including scenarios for discussion to support an participatory learning process.


